Accessibility in our parishes is about ensuring that everyone has the same opportunity to partake in the sacraments and parish life in a way that *suits them best*. Caritas is working to support parishes in developing their understanding of accessibility, serving to welcome, integrate, and increase participation in church life. Caritas wants to support you in identifying unmet needs of clergy, parishioners, their family or friends. These may be physical, mental & emotional, learning, sensory and/or communication needs. The aim then would be to support you in creating a co-produced plan to overcome these barriers and prepare you for the future. Often, the smallest change can make a world of difference.

This is a **guide-template** of questions for you to consider. It is possible that not all questions will be applicable to your parish, and that you need to consider additional ideas, but they should provide a starting place when reviewing accessibility in your parish.
